The Pelican Center focus is on intensive coordinated interdisciplinary training and education of child welfare practitioners (children's and indigent parents' attorneys, judges, child protection staff, CASAs, foster parents, district and child welfare agency attorneys and others.

- Data projects;
- Improving the quality of legal representation for children and indigent parents;
- Improving the quality of hearings, especially through greater participation by children and foster parents;
- Overseeing projects and approaches to improve child well-being outcomes;
- Improving ICWA compliance;
- Ensuring CIP Participation in the federal child welfare system review process;
- Encouraging efforts related to continuous quality improvement (CQI) of global child welfare outcomes.
